## Outdoor Lighting Regulations

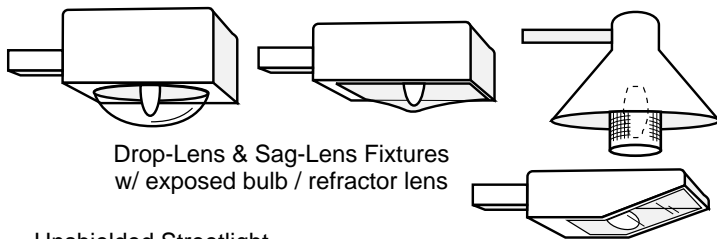
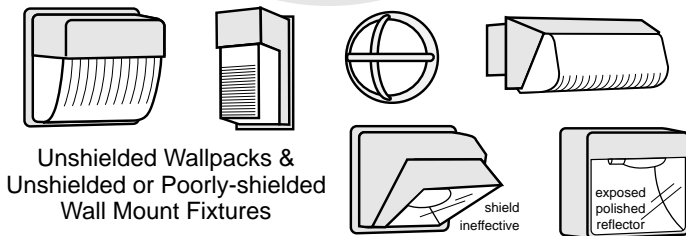
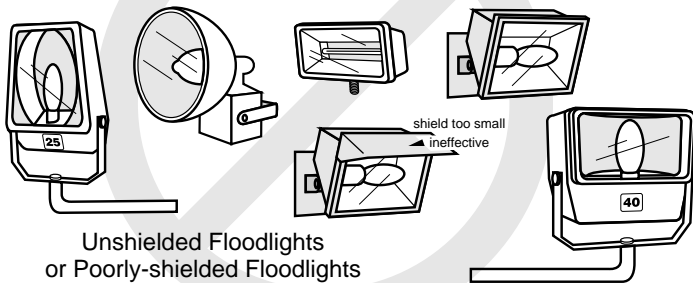
On February 1, 2000, the Darlington City Council enacted specific outdoor lighting regulations. These regulations are designed to benefit residents and businesses in Darlington by constituting better nighttime visibility, public safety, energy efficiency, and preservation of the natural night environment.

**Note:** When taking out an electrical permit, provide an iso-footcandle plot and fixture "cut sheet" for proposed lighting along with permit application. Lighting levels set by the Illuminating Engineering Society of North America (IESNA) shall not be exceeded.

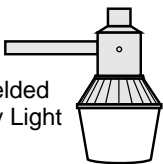
Fixtures that produce glare and light trespass



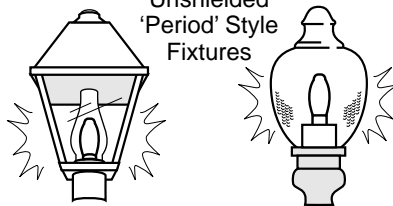
Unshielded Streetlight

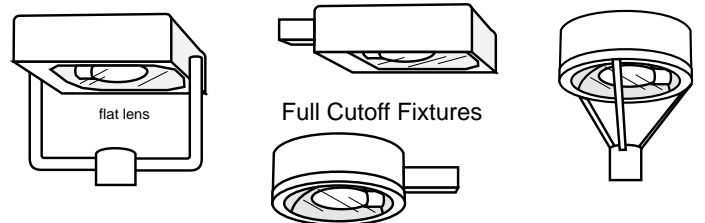


Drop-Lens Canopy Fixtures

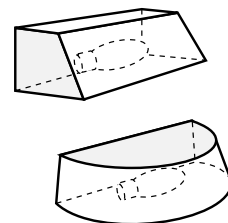
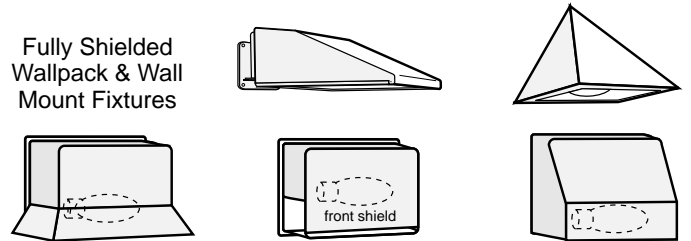


#### Acceptable

Fully Shielded Wallpack & Wall Mount Fixtures

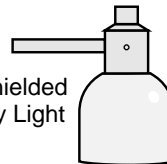


Fully Shielded Fixtures

Full Cutoff Streetlight

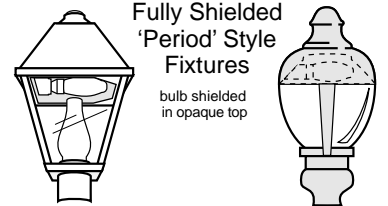


Fully Shielded Security Light

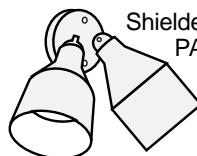
